<Highlight 1>: Junior Reporter Club:

Only one year after the devastation of Cyclone Enawo, another cyclone struck the region. The storm was less strong, but subsequent floods were serious for all villages and towns in the intervention zone. Junior reporter club members went to the village areas to inspect damages. In order to produce radio reports they conducted interviews about people's opinion on the possible cause of the more frequent occurrence of cyclones and floods in the region. Reports were broadcast on local radio station.

<Highlight 2>: Patrols activity

WCS and community rangers conducted 15 patrols in the red zones of the Makira Natural Park, particularly in the forest corridors under restoration. During the patrols they detected and recorded illicit human installations, illegal camps, forest clearings, and lemur traps. Six active lemur traps were found and destroyed to ensure safer areas for lemurs and other animals.
