<Highlight 1>: Visit of the GEF Satoyama Project coordinator

From the 19th to 21st of June, Devon Dublin, coordinator of the GEF Satoyama Project visited the office of Amazónicos por la Amazonía – AMPA in the province of Bolívar, La Libertad, as a part of the annual supervision.

The visit included direct conversation with the quinoa and honey producers and the primate monitors, who are working with in the Alto Huayabamba Conservation Concession – AHCC, and its buffer zone.

In AMPA's office in Bolívar, the GEF Satoyama Project coordinator spoke to the board of directors of the Association of organic producers. He also spoke with a group of apicultural producers and primate monitors. Later, in the village of Sundia, in the buffer zone of the AHCC, the coordinator was able to meet the producer families of this area to learn about their experiences and expectations.

<Highlight 2>: Training events on planting and phytosanitary control in Sundia

On the 22nd and 23rd of May, training events were held on planting and phytosanitary control in the village of Sundia; these events were theoretical and practical.

During the trainings, the producers built composters with which they will produce compost to use on their crops. They also produced bioles, which they will use as foliar fertilizers in all their crops. These activities seek to generate new skills that allow producers to optimize their production in an organic way.

<Highlight 3>: Training events on family participation, activities compatible with forests and management of productive units in Sundia

On May 24th, the trainings on the participation of the family in productive activities, forests compatible activities and the management of productive units under the business were carried out with the producers of Sundia.

The students of the School of Sundia and the producers attended the family participation event and activities compatible with forest. The group participated in activities that helped them visualize the perception of themselves with respect to men and women.

With regard to the event on management of productive units under a business approach, a discussion was held to highlight the importance of orderly management of the area, adequate recording of activities and costs, as well as the need for investment, to eventually see their results in terms of production increases.
