<Highlight 1>: One publication on Facebook and tweeter, the 1st of June of 2018 referring to the participative ecological monitoring:

“To protect better the Livingstone’s fruit bats, Dahari put in place a participative monitoring system with the owners of the roost sites (four). The objective is to realize the assessment of the density and the variety of the trees which are on the plot. It’s also to define better the limits of the lands used by the Livingstone’s in each roosts sites. In total, they are 738 big trees (up to 10 cm of diameter) divided in 49 species from 30 families, have been counted. The total area of the four roost sites (3,5 Hectares) beneficiated of this rigorous monitoring. This work will permit to each owner to manage better his field protecting in the same time the roost sites.”

<Highlight 2>: An article written by Nabil Jaffar published the 17 of May of 2018 in the Masiwa journal (<http://urlz.fr/7q7q>)

Abstract: “The agricultural fair was realized the 16 of May in Mutsamudu. The objective was to promote the diversity of the local productions, facilitate the disposal of the agricultural products for the farmers from the rural areas supported by Dahari and value the quality of these products issued of the organic farming. The 3rd edition mobilised 89 farmers from 11 villages where Dahari work, a dozen of stakeholders (private, civil society,...) and received more than 1250 visitors.”

<Highlight 3>: Published on the Facebook and tweeter, the 25 of April. Signing of the new agreements in Moya and Nindri.

“Two agreements for the roost sites of Moya and Nindri were signed the 13 of March and the 5 of April between Dahari and the owners. In the presence of the mayors, the objective of these agreements is to protect the roost site of the Livingstone’s fruit bats, promote the natural reforestation of the fields and improve the living conditions of the owners. The responsibility of Dahari is to accompany the owner for the valorisation of the plot through agricultural supports.”
