<Highlight 1>: Find out important fish habitats along Mali Hka River and May Hka River to establish more Fishery Conservation Zones (FCZs) in collaboration with the local communities for the sustainability of fisheries resources. (Jul-August 2017)

According to the requirement of fish conservation for the sustainability of livelihood of the local communities, more important fish habitats were surveyed together with the local communities along the tributaries that flow into the Mali Hka River and main channel of the May Hka River.

<Highlight 2>: Small grant provision to the project villages in Hponganrazi Wildlife Sanctuary. (August 2017)

In Hponganrazi Wildlife Sanctuary, tilling machines were provided to improve the yield in their agriculture and reduce the amount of time spent in the field. Therefore, all FCZ communities in Hponganrazi Wildlife Sanctuary got benefit from the small grant provision.

<Highlight 3>: Awareness talks with communities in Hponganrazi and Indawgyi regarding to FCZ and small grant provision. (Aug & Sept 2017)

Awareness talks on FCZ establishments were conducted in Hponganrazi Wildlife Sanctuary and monitoring of small grants were organized in Indawgyi Wildlife Sanctuary.

<Highlight 4>: FCZ boundary demarcation in Indawgyi. (Sept 2017)

FCZ boundaries were demarcated in Indawgyi in collaboration with the Department of Fisheries, Wildlife Sanctuary, Friends of Wildlife and communities.
