### < Highlight 1>: Ethnography outcomes were socialized.

The ethnography on women's role in the landscape was completed and results were shared with participants. A poster with the results was delivered to all the participants.

# <Highlight 2>: Consolidation of a touristic project in La Germania continues.

During January and March 2019, four meetings with the community of La Germania (San Vicente de Chucurí) were carried out to consolidate the Agri-eco-touristic project. Two of such meetings were devoted to a short training on projects formulation. The final draft of the statutes as well as the project's logo were produced with community active engagement. New routes were also drafted.

### <Highlight 3>: Workshop: Second Measurement of Socio-Ecological Resilience Indicators

On March 9th, the second measurement of socioecological resilience indicators was conducted with the community of the micro-basin of Las Cruces. The workshop was held at the farm Varsovia, located in the Varsovia sector of the Merida *vereda*. During the workshop, the 15 indicators that were prioritized and evaluated in the first measurement in March 2017 were assessed again. The workshop lasted 9 hours and 18 actors participated, 11 of them women and 7 men. This workshop showed an increase in the qualification in the axes of Knowledge and innovation, Governance and social equity, Livelihoods and well-being, and Biodiversity and ecosystem protection compared to the measurement carried out in March 2017.

# <Highlight 4>: Workshop: Rethinking our Territory

On March 19th, the workshop "Rethinking our territory" was held in CONULPAZ (San Vicente de Chucurí), where the indicators of socioecological resilience were measured with stakeholders (community actors and representatives of the institutions) that are present in the area. The workshop lasted 9 hours and was attended by 24 participants, of whom 16 are men and 8 are women. The workshop was very important because many of the actors who attended did not know the methodology and it was very pleasant and contributed to their knowledge of the landscape. As a result of the measurement the creation of three lines of action was obtained. These lines are: 1. Community organization, 2. Institutional articulation and 3. Knowledge and enhancement of biodiversity. Stakeholders are currently developing actions for the strengthening and consolidate these lines.

## < Highlight 5 >: Final presentation of project results

On March 23th an open presentation of results was organized at COLNUPAZ. All participants in the project were invited as well as stakeholders. In different thematic tables, the outcomes of the project's components were presented and discussed with attendees. During the event, participants received material produced by the research team including posters on knowledge and practices, as well as biodiversity catalogs (mammals, birds, ants, etc.). Members of FiNCO and La Germania touristic project actively participated, by exposing their experience to visitants. 60 people attended this event, 30 of them are men and 30 women. Some of them were representatives of institutions with presence in the landscape; other were students of CONULPAZ and project participants.
