<Highlight 1>: Patrolling activities

From April to June 2018, park rangers and community rangers from 14 community management sites conducted 18 patrols in the Makira Natural Park including the forest corridors under restoration in Lokaitra. Patrol teams detected and recorded illicit human activities, including illegal camps, logging, forest clearings, lemur traps, and mine extraction. One active lemur trap was found during the patrol and was destroyed.

Since January 2018, a total of 561 households, including 383 men and 95 women, have benefitted from trainings on organic clove nursery and planting techniques.
